Entry requirements:

- Applicants must hold University Entrance or a recognised equivalent, such as International Baccalaureate or Cambridge International, **OR** an International high school equivalency, **OR** an equivalent overseas qualification as assessed.
- Applicants 20 years or older who don't meet entry requirements may be admitted if they can demonstrate the ability to complete the programme.
- Applicants must meet the requirements of the Children's Act 2014 and its subsequent amendments.
- Applicants with English as a second language must provide evidence of meeting English language requirements according to Rule 22 of the NZQA Programme Approval and Accreditation Rules 2025 for a level 7 programme.

Professional ECE classroom experience:

- Weekly practice in an approved early childhood centre (minimum 18 hours per week).
- Six 20-day block placements across the programme
- Additional classroom hours per week to support international students.
