All applicants must:

- Have completed a New Zealand Diploma of Teaching (Primary) level 7 OR a Bachelor's degree at level 7 (360 credits) OR a Bachelor's degree with honours at level 8 (480 credits) OR a Master's degree at level 9 (240 credits) qualification OR an equivalent overseas qualification as assessed.
- Meet the requirements of the Children's Act 2014 and its subsequent amendments.
- For applicants with English as a second language, please provide evidence of meeting English language requirements according to Rule 22 of the NZQA Programme Approval and Accreditation Rules 2022 for a Level 7 programme.
